

### East Baton Rouge Parish School System

Two schools, Polk Elementary and Robert E. Lee High School, have been waived from sanctions because its testing population was composed over 25% displaced Students.

Three EBR schools are labeled "Academically Unacceptable" but will not be required to implement sanctions. These schools had Baseline School Performance Scores above 60.0 in 2004-05 and are free from sanctions due to the extensive changes made to the Accountability System.

Sixteen EBR schools are in School Improvement 3. They must continue to offer school choice and rewrite their School Improvement Plans with the support of a District Assistance Team. They are eligible for a Distinguished Educator if their district enters into a partnership with the Louisiana Department of Education. If these schools are Title I schools, they must also offer Supplemental Educational Services, which is defined by the U.S. Department of Education as tutoring or extra help provided to students in reading, language arts/English, and math from approved providers. This extra help can be provided before or after school, on weekends, or in the summer.

\*\*Must begin Choice transfer process upon receipt of school performance scores; will offer SES.

They remain eligible for a Distinguished Educator if their district enters into a partnership with the Louisiana Department of Education.
